



Regatta Travel Fees – 2015

Competing in a Midwest regatta costs, on average, between \$50-\$100/rower. Competing in a National regatta (Hooch, Sarasota, Nationals) costs, on average, between \$150-\$200/rower. This does not include your lodging, transportation or food during a regatta.

ROWERS:

The following expenses are part of the rowers' responsibility when traveling to a regatta*:

- Trailer fee (\$5/regatta) – this helps pay for registration and maintenance of the boat trailer
- Truck rental to tow the boat trailer
- Hotel room for truck driver
- Gas for the truck
- Entry fees for the event(s) you race
- Coxswain hotel room and travel
- Coaches hotel room and travel
- Boat rental

**some of these expenses may not occur during a regatta*

COXSWAINS:

- Coxswains pay \$20/night for a hotel room. Coxswains will share a hotel room with a rower. The rower will pay for the room and submit receipt to IRC for reimbursement of the coxswains half. The coxswain will pay IRC \$20/night for their room.
- IRC Membership and Program fees are waived for coxswains.
- Coxswains are encouraged to carpool with the rowers.
- Coxswains are responsible for their own food.
- Non-IRC coxswains are paid \$0.25/mile to travel to Indianapolis to catch a ride, or to travel to the race site.

COACHES:

- Rowers pay for the coaches hotel room. Coaches will room with a rower. The rower will pay for the room and submit receipt to IRC for reimbursement of the coaches half.
- Coaches are encouraged to carpool with the rowers. If coaches need to travel alone, receipts for gas and travel can be submitted to IRC for reimbursement. Rowers will be responsible for these costs.
